

Notes on SVNP meeting March 14, 2013

Larry Warfield of the Merrimack Valley Camera Club was our guest speaker, on the subject of the Concord portion of the Great Meadows National Wildlife Refuge. A large audience of SVNP members, fellow photographers, and Traditions residents enjoyed his presentation.

Larry is a project-oriented photographer, and a year in the life of Great Meadows, from January 1 to December 29, 2011, was one of his pet projects. He told us a great deal about its history and the efforts to preserve and conserve wildlife there. He started his presentation with images, many of them birds, taken at other locations, "just to get things going" and to give us a sample of his work.

Larry then showed a time-lapse video he had created at Great Meadows during which his camera was set, on a tripod, of course, to shoot an image every 30 seconds. This involved a day-long vigil and changing the memory card and the battery in his camera a number of times, hence the occasional camera shake. The result was a fascinating video showing the view from the observation tower at Great Meadows beginning just at the break of dawn till the sun was sinking in the west. He picked a day when the clouds would be interesting, but otherwise the sky was clear.

Larry is very familiar with the many nooks and crannies of Great Meadows, and shoots there in all kinds of weather. He presented a twenty-minute slide show, with music, of images taken of a variety of flora and fauna at Great Meadows in all seasons and a variety of weather conditions during 2011.

Larry uses the Nikon camera platform. His favorite lens is a professional quality 70 – 300 mm with vibration reduction. He uses other lenses as well: Tokina 12-24, Sigma 105, 500 mm/f4 lens, with some use of warming filters. Quite a lot of equipment to carry on the two-mile hike around the periphery of the ponds at Great Meadows.
